<b>ANDRITZ GROUP</b>	Johannes Kisser (formerly of ECA Watch)	<b>TURKEY, BRAZIL, TASMANIA</b> <b>Large plant construction:</b> Participation in the largest and most environmentally damaging large-scale construction projects worldwide (including Illisu and Belo Monte). Forced relocation without fair compensation. Flooding of cultural artifacts.
<b>Asia Pulp &amp; Paper (APP)</b>	Terra! Onlus <a href="http://www.terraonlus.it">www.terraonlus.it</a>	<b>INDONESIA</b> <b>Paper production:</b> Destruction of more than 100 million hectares of natural forest in Sumatra. Displacement of people and (endangered) animals. Human rights violations.
<b>Bank of America</b>	Rainforest Action Network <a href="http://www.ran.org">www.ran.org</a>	<b>USA and ASIA</b> <b>Finance:</b> Biggest coal investor in USA (USD 4.3 billion in two years). Also finances mountaintop removal. Promotes coal exports to Asia. Goal: Opening up of Asian coal market.

<b>BIDCO</b>	Child Care Foundation Uganda <a href="http://www.chcare.webs.com">www.chcare.webs.com</a>	<b>UGANDA</b> <b>Palm oil production:</b> Clearing of 40% of Bugala Island natural forest. Violation of environmental standards, contamination of waters vital to population. Destruction of wells.
<b>Cement Corporation of India (CCI)</b>	Curves n Shades	<b>INDIA</b> <b>Cement production:</b> No provisions for the safety of the population, health problems in the population from cement dust.
<b>Dangote Cement</b>	Shelter Watch <a href="http://www.shelterwatchng.org">www.shelterwatchng.org</a>	<b>NIGERIA</b> <b>Cement production:</b> Nepotism, use of forced Chinese workers at dumping prices, death threats.
<b>Danzer</b>	Global Witness <a href="http://www.globalwitness.org">www.globalwitness.org</a>	<b>DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO</b> <b>Lumbering:</b> Long history of purchasing timber from conflict zones, for example during civil war, with violation of arms embargoes and corruption laws, environmental ruin, illegal logging, human rights violations. Denunciation by NGOs. Collaboration with violent "security forces."

<b>ENEL</b>	Greenpeace Chile <a href="http://www.greenpeace.org/chile/">www.greenpeace.org/chile/</a>	<b>SLOVAKIA, ROMANIA, KALININGRAD, GUATEMALA, CHILE</b> <b>Energy:</b> Construction of several outdated and particularly dangerous atomic power plants, partially in violation of international law. Construction of 5 massive dams in Chile without the consultation of the population or regard for environmental concerns.
<b>Freeport-McMoRan</b>	Indonesia Human Rights Committee <a href="http://indonesiahumanrights.org.nz">indonesiahumanrights.org.nz</a>	<b>WEST PAPUA</b> <b>Gold and copper mining:</b> Contamination of rivers and nature reserves, violent repression, expulsion and marginalization of indigenous peoples.
<b>Goldcorp Inc</b>	Center for International Environmental Law (CIEL) <a href="http://www.ciel.org">www.ciel.org</a>	<b>GUATEMALA and HONDURAS</b> <b>Gold mining:</b> Contamination and drying up of rivers, land confiscation, repression of indigenous peoples, labor law violations.
<b>Golden Star Resources, Goldfields Ghana, AngloGold Ashanti</b>	Centre for Environmental Impact Analysis (CEIA) <a href="http://www.ceiagh.org">www.ceiagh.org</a>	<b>GHANA</b> <b>Gold mining:</b> Cyanide disposal in rivers and farmland, no compensation payments, contamination of groundwater and drinking water, use of armed security forces.
<b>Granjas Atuneras de Golfito</b>	Andy Bystrom / Pretoma <a href="http://www.pretoma.org">www.pretoma.org</a>	<b>COSTA RICA</b> <b>Fisheries:</b> Plans for a tuna fish farm on Costa Rica's coast, endangerment of threatened species such as turtles, dolphins, sharks, whales, etc. Endangerment of tourist beaches (surf tourism).
<b>Hershey</b>	Green America <a href="http://www.greenamerica.org">www.greenamerica.org</a>	<b>WEST AFRICA and USA</b> <b>Chocolate production:</b> Low-price production through use of cocoa harvested under inhumane conditions (including child labor). Replacement of union-organized U.S. personnel with low-cost temporary workers.
<b>Huntsman</b>	Unia <a href="http://www.unia.ch">www.unia.ch</a>	<b>SWITZERLAND</b> <b>Textiles:</b> Seven hundred dismissals despite reassurances to the contrary, at best poor safety in Asian production plants.
<b>Kenya Pipeline Company</b>	Global Deaf Connection <a href="http://www.deafconnection.org">www.deafconnection.org</a>	<b>KENYA</b> <b>Oil transport:</b> Non-compliance with environmental legislation, leading to leaks in pipelines, spills, and fires resulting in deaths.
<b>Lahmeyer International</b>	ECCHR - European Center for Constitutional and Human Rights <a href="http://www.ecchr.eu">www.ecchr.eu</a>	<b>NORTH SUDAN</b> <b>Engineering and consulting firm:</b> Drawing up of an inadequate environmental impact assessment. Result: up to 78,000 people relocated, violent evictions, often no compensation payments. Corruption.
<b>Mehta Group (and Sugar Corporation of Uganda Ltd-SCOUL)</b>	Peter Oluka & Ismael Kato	<b>UGANDA</b> <b>Sugar production:</b> Clearing of natural forest for sugar production, competition with food production, promotion of political unrest.
<b>Mercadona</b>	Western Sahara Resource Watch <a href="http://www.wsrw.org">www.wsrw.org</a>	<b>WEST SAHARA</b> <b>Supermarket:</b> Acquisition of 30 million cans of sardines from illegally-occupied West Sahara region, thus supporting Moroccan oppression. Overfishing.

<b>NESA</b>	Gesellschaft für bedrohte Völker, Schweiz (Association for Threatened Peoples, Switzerland) <a href="http://www.gfbv.ch">www.gfbv.ch</a>	<b>BRAZIL</b> <b>Energy:</b> Forced resettlement of up to 40,000 people, no voice in process and no compensation, inhumane working conditions, insufficient environmental protection measures, no voice for the indigenous peoples of the region.
<b>Novartis</b>	Jagruti	<b>INDIA</b> <b>Pharmaceuticals:</b> Prevention of inexpensive generics production for India and developing countries.

<b>Repower</b>	Zukunft statt Kohle (Future Instead of Coal) <a href="http://www.zukunftstattkohle.ch">www.zukunftstattkohle.ch</a>	<b>ITALIA</b> <b>Energy:</b> Planning and construction of coal power plants in Germany and Italy, human rights violations and environmental destruction at coal mine in Colombia, bribery, targeted manipulation, corrupt methods, lies.
<b>Rimbunan Hinjau</b>	MFROA Madang Forest Resource Owners' Association Inc	<b>PAPUA NEW GUINEA</b> <b>Timber industry:</b> Illegal logging of natural forest for palm oil plantations, miserable working conditions.
<b>SAMSUNG</b>	Supporters for Health and Right of People in Semiconductor industry (SHARPs) <a href="http://stop-samsung.wordpress.com">stop-samsung.wordpress.com</a>	<b>SOUTH KOREA</b> <b>Electronics:</b> Use of toxic chemicals without suitable worker protection, denial of responsibility for the resulting illnesses of workers, repression of human rights activists, union interference, embezzlement, tax flight.
<b>Shell / Exxon</b>	Rainbow Gate Foundation Nigeria <a href="http://www.rainbowgatefoundation.org">www.rainbowgatefoundation.org</a>	<b>NIGERIA</b> <b>Oil:</b> Severe pollution of the Niger Delta over decades, gas flaring, contamination of drinking water, open disposal of toxic waste.
<b>Sugar Corporation of Uganda Ltd- SCOUL</b>	Robert Opali	<b>UGANDA</b> <b>Sugar production:</b> Water pollution, clearing of forest, threat to rare animals, contribution to food shortages.
<b>Syngenta</b>	Pesticide Action Network <a href="http://www.panna.org">www.panna.org</a>	<b>GLOBAL SOUTH</b> <b>Agrochemical:</b> Sale and aggressive marketing of, and ruthless lobbying for, highly-toxic herbicides in the Global South. Intimidation of scientists.
<b>TEPCO</b>	Finance Green Watch <a href="http://www.financegreenwatch.org">www.financegreenwatch.org</a>	<b>JAPAN</b> <b>Energy:</b> Operation of the Fukushima reactors, too few prior safety standards, poor emergency response.

<b>Total</b>	Decision	<b>YEMEN</b> <b>Oil:</b> Gas flaring, avoidance of international safety standards, corrupt sales methods.
<b>Ukrhydroenergo</b>	Society for Creative Initiatives "Buchak"	<b>UKRAINE</b> <b>Energy:</b> Dam construction without regard for the population, flooding of cultural artifacts, non-compliance with environmental laws, radioactive contamination of the Dnieper River, non-compliance with recommendations of the World Commission on Dams.
<b>Vale</b>	International Rivers, Amazon Watch and Justiça nos Trilhos <a href="http://www.internationalrivers.org">www.internationalrivers.org</a>	<b>BRAZIL, CHILE, CANADA, MOZAMBIQUE</b> <b>Mining:</b> Joint owner of the Belo Monte construction consortium NESA, forced resettlement of up to 40,000 people with no voice or compensation, inhumane working conditions, insufficient environmental protection measures, no voice for indigenous peoples in the region, illegal land seizure.
<b>Veolia</b>	International Derail Veolia Network	<b>WEST BANK</b> <b>Public Transport:</b> operation of a tram line and bus services supporting the consolidation and expansion of Israel's illegal settlements in the West Bank and East Jerusalem by linking them to Israel; discrimination against Palestinians
<b>Vinci SA</b>	Movement to Defend Khimki Forest <a href="http://www.khimkiforest.org">www.khimkiforest.org</a>	<b>RUSSIA</b> <b>Road building:</b> Construction of a road link between Moscow and St. Petersburg through Khimki Forest, an important area for biodiversity where 30 highly-endangered species live. Suspicion of massive corruption. Tolerance of physical violence against demonstrators (by security personnel).
<b>Xinjiang Tianye</b>	Shawan Oasis Sustainable Development Institute <a href="http://www.xinjiangoasis.org">www.xinjiangoasis.org</a>	<b>CHINA</b> <b>Agrochemical:</b> Emission of thick smoke and toxic dust from factories, students paid less than national minimum wage and paid no overtime, contamination of water and soil in surrounding areas.
